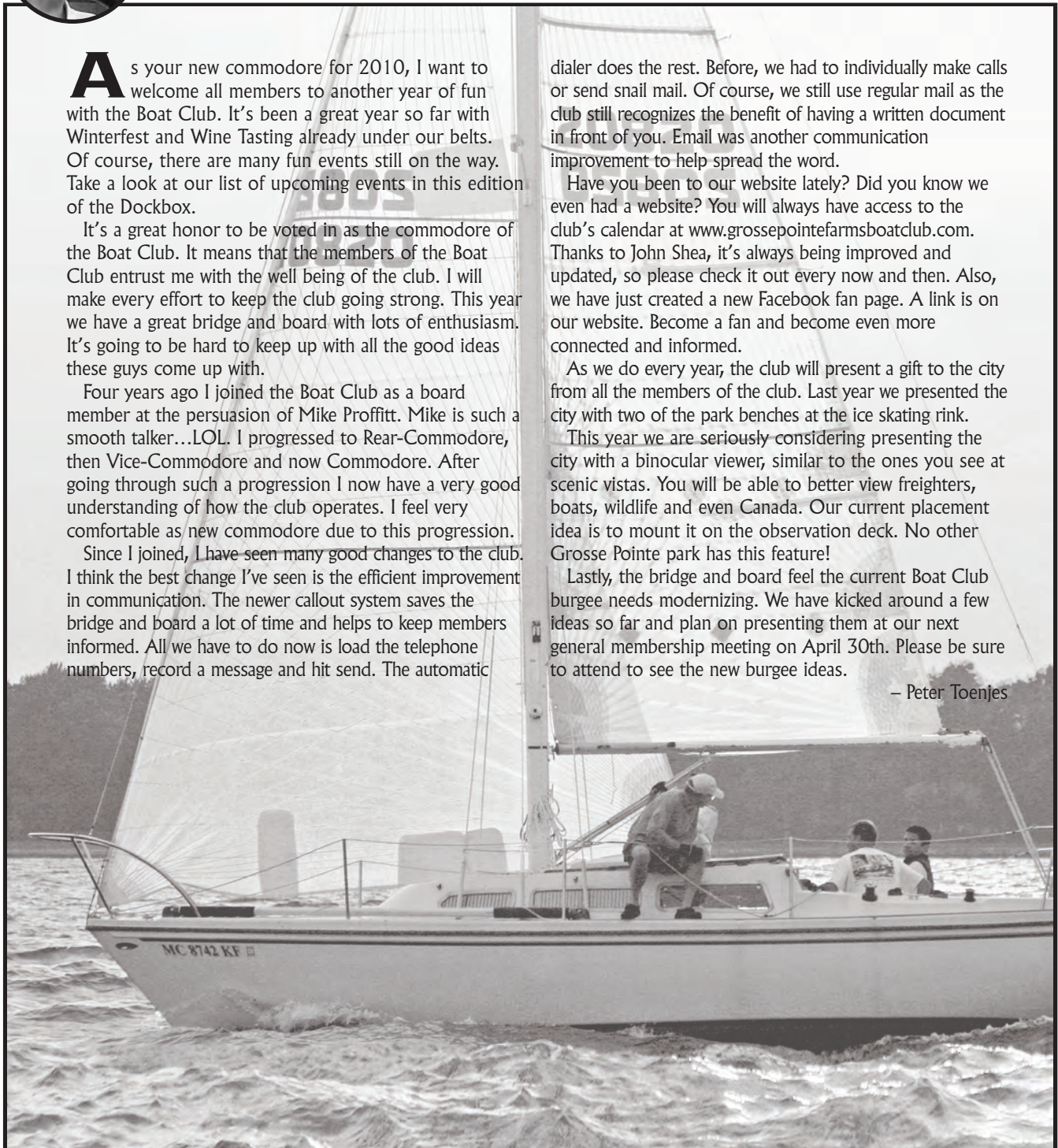

DATES SET FOR THURSDAY NIGHT RACES

This summer, the Boat Club will again sponsor the Thursday Night Race Series off Grosse Pointe Farms Pier Park. The start line extends eastward into Lake St Clair from the seawall near the gazebo, and spectators may view the racing from the path or benches along the seawall, the observation deck or the east end of the park. Bring some refreshments and come on down and enjoy the view.

This year the first five-race series will be held on each Thursday night in June and on July 1st, with the second series following on each Thursday in August and on September 2nd. The first section of racers starts at 7 pm with other sections starting at five-minute intervals. Both

spinnaker and jib-and-main sections will participate, and once again we expect about 30 race boats to compete for flags and trophies that will be awarded following the July 1st and September 2nd races. Club members are invited to attend the awards parties and share in the food, drink and tall tales of racing action.

Club members are needed to help on the race committee and to help with the awards parties. Members with boats are also needed to help with the racing marks before and after each race.
