With this our 60 year celebration as the Grosse Pointe Farms Boat Club, it is notable to mention that our club has a long and honorable history.

Year after year the GPFBC continues to partner with the G P Farms Department of Parks and Recreation to provide meaningful and memorable events for the residents of G P Farms and their guests. A Few Examples are the Fishing Rodeo, the Ice Cream Social, the Winterfest on the Hill, and under the Direction of next years Vice Commodore, Glen Logan, we will again be sponsoring the Grosse Pointe Farms Regatta 2016, which is arguably the most prestigious event in all the Points. Fifteen fun, family friendly events over the 3 day weekend of the GP Farms fireworks display.

Over the years our Fund Raising Events have allowed us to continue to donate items to the Park. And these are substantial donation items, most recently the Gerow Observation Deck on the north east side of the Park, overlooking Lake Saint Clair. A Brief History of the Boat Club...

The Grosse Pointe Boat Owners' Club was founded in 1955 and had twenty-two members. In 1957 the name was changed to the Grosse Pointe Farms Boat Club. From 1955 the Club assumed responsibility for the annual Regatta (held since 1953). The early Regattas included a review of decorated boats, boat races and an elected queen. As community interest grew so did the size and scope of the Regatta. Raffle tickets and brochure advertising were introduced to help finance the weekend. The program of events was regularly expanded to include activities for young and old. The club itself grew-today it has about 115 member families. In addition to the Regatta, the Club present for the community such events as the Thursday Summer Series (sailboat races), Winterfest on the Hill, and a Blessing of the Fleet Ceremony. Club activities are now year around and include the Commodore's Ball, Wine Tasting, Feather Bowling, 2-Sail Boat Race Parties, Lobster Roast, and Boat Rendezvous to name a few. The Club has always taken an active interest in the Pier Park. The Grosse Pointe Boat Club will continue to improve its community-wide activities in its effort to enrich our quality of life. We believe this kind of effort has helped Grosse Pointe Farms to become one of the finest communities in which to live.
